ETHICAL FRAMEWORK AND POLICY

The Global Journal of Social Scientific Research (GJSSR) is committed to fostering ethical research practices and ensuring the integrity of the publication process. This framework outlines the ethical principles that guide our operations and the expectations for all participants in the research and publication ecosystem.

I Ethical Principles

- 1. Integrity and Honesty
 - All research must be conducted with integrity and honesty, ensuring that findings are reported accurately and transparently.
 - Authors must disclose any potential biases or conflicts of interest that may affect their research.
- 2. Respect for Research Participants

II. Authorship and Contributions
